Question #1: Would MDOT further quantify each Task below as referenced in Part 3 so that the Consultant may further anticipate their level of effort?

- **Conduct storm water program inspections**

ANSWER: For purposes of submitting a proposal, the Consultant should assume that inspections will be performed on MDOT and LPA construction projects approximately every other month and inspections on State Aid construction projects approximately every month. MDOT may modify the frequency of inspections throughout the duration of the contract. Based on historical data, the number of projects anticipated may run between the following ranges and are dependent on several factors which could alter the number of projects in a given year:

MDOT projects – Approximately 50-60 projects per year

LPA projects – Approximately 20-30 projects per year

State Aid projects – Approximately 20-30 projects per year

- **Conduct storm water program documentation verifications for quality performance**

ANSWER: For purposes of submitting a proposal, the Consultant should assume document verification for all relevant projects every month for MDOT, State Aid, and the LPA. This will be done primarily from the office, but some field verification will be required.

- **Review erosion control plans (ECPs)**

ANSWER: For purposes of submitting a proposal, the Consultant should assume that they will be asked to review all ECPs. Based on historical data, the number of ECPs anticipated may run between approximately 45-60 ECPs per year and are dependent on several factors which could alter the number of ECPs in a given year.

- **Update and conduct storm water training**

ANSWER: For purposes of submitting a proposal, the Consultant should assume one round of training, including three one-day sessions, for each District and other applicable personnel plus some additional supplemental training.
